Choose 1 activity to complete each day. It doesn't matter which order you do them in. 😊

## Phonics :Read Write Inc.

We have put additional RWI materials in a new 'Channels' section. You can find 'Channels' next to where you find 'Files' and 'Assignments'.

These materials are optional and detail daily lessons that can be done over the week.

Have a look, they are quite detailed but remember these are optional. Maybe just focus on spelling the red and green words. There are now red and green flashcards in the Files section, under Literacy.

If you would prefer to keep things simple, keep tuning into the Ruth Miskin's You Tube channel for her daily speed sounds lessons. Just search 'Ruth Miskin' on YouTube or go to her website for a clicky link to the YouTube videos. <https://www.ruthmiskin.com>

Each lesson is available for 24 hours so don't panic if you miss it - you can watch it later in the day. The timetable for these lessons is in the files section in Teams.

If your child has been taught Read Write Inc by Mrs Mclean/Miss Grieve or Miss Thornton most recently, they should watch the Set 1 lessons. If their most recent RWI teacher was Mrs Nelson/Mrs Young or Mrs Marrins they should watch the Set 2 lessons.

There are also some new phonics sheets you can choose from in Files in the P1 worksheets section.

## Writing

Think about a story that you know well. It might be a traditional fairy tale like The Little Gingerbread Man, Goldilocks, Jack and the Beanstalk. It might be one that we have read in school like the Gruffalo.

Draw your own story map to help you retell the story. You can find an example of one in 'Files' in the 'Helpful info for parents and carers' section.



## Handwriting

Practice writing your letters. This week it is Robot letters.

The worksheets can be found in the files section.

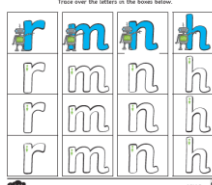
If you can't print them out, just copy them onto some paper by hand. Write the letters in a yellow or orange pen or pencil for your child to trace over.

Remember to include

-all the body parts

-details in the background - where are you? How can I tell?

-Can I guess the film or programme?

Tell an adult all about your picture story.

Have a go at writing a sentence or 2 about your picture. Your adult can write the sentences for you too.

Remember the 5 fingers for writing:

-Capital letter

-Full stop

-Finger spaces

-Fred Talk words

-Letter formation
