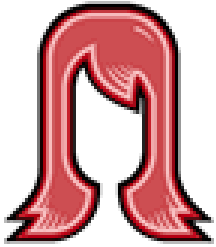




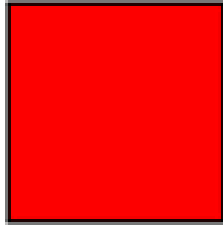
P4 Spelling Lists

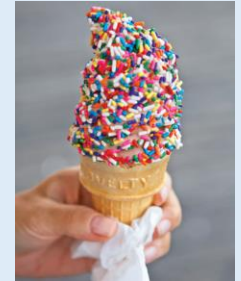

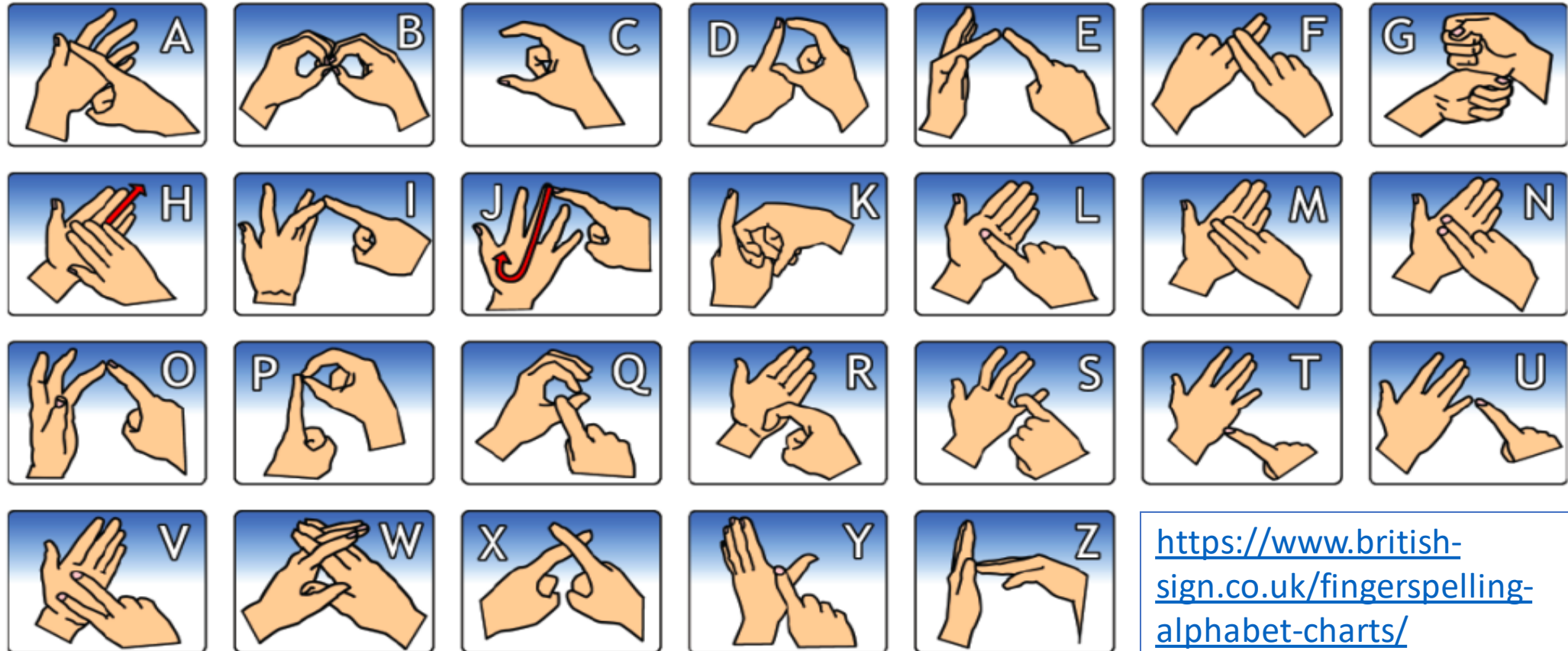
Start with Look, **Cover**, Write, **Check**.
