Spelling rule of the week: suffixes '-sion' and '-tion'





A suffix is a group of a few letters put at the end of a word.

Firstly, -sion makes a buzzing sound like in vision. Secondly, '-tion' makes a sh-n sound, like in nation.

Top Tips for learning tricky spelling words



Sometimes it can be tricky to learn longer spelling words and know what rule to use. Here are some tips!



1) Say the word out loud. **Listen to the sound** you make when you say the suffix. Is it making a buzzing sound (-sion) or a sh sound (-tion)?



2) Break the word up in to syllables. This is how many 'beats' are in the word. For example, 'information' = in - for - ma - tion. This helps when you are spelling the word.



3) Highlight the part of the word you find tricky and keep practising using Look Cover Write Check.




4) Make up a rhyme or song to help you remember a tricky spelling. Be creative!



Write sentences using each of your spelling words. You may use more than one word in a sentence, but you must write at least 5 sentences.


Underline your spelling words.


Other Handed
