The extra word is another verb, it's called an auxiliary verb. The auxiliary verbs that we use to describe the future are 'shall' and 'will.' 'Will' can be used with all the pronouns (I, you, he, she, it, we, you, they), but 'shall' should only be used with 'I' and 'we'.
