<p>Spelling Practice your spelling words using the method of Look, Cover, Write and Check to make sure you've got it right! 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This grid has spelling activities that you can use to practice your spelling. You have used some in class before and you may have one that you like to use. Try using a different one each practice to make learning your spelling more challenging.

UPPER and Lower Write each of your words out two times. Write in UPPERCASE the first time and in lowercase the second time.	Pyramid Writing Write each of your words like a pyramid: s so som some	ABC Order Write your words out in alphabetical order	Air Writing Write your words in the air with your finger. Ask someone to read your words as you write. Or ask someone to air write the letters you tell them to spell your word.
Curly Words First write out your words in normal writing. Next, write them again in curly letters.	Backwards Words Write your words out forwards then backwards.	F Spelling Flowers Draw a big flower. Write each of your spelling words on one of the petals!	Across and Down Write your words across and down, sharing the same first letter. when h e n
Rainbow Words Write your words out in pencil. Next draw around each letter 5 more times using a different coloured pencil.	Join the Dots Write each of your words using dots. Then join the dots with a coloured pencil to make your word.	Fancy Letters Write each of your words using fancy writing. Your letters could be curly or dotty... or whatever you decide!	Blue Vowels Write out each of your words. Go over the vowels in each word using blue pencil
