- Why is this invention important? Is it still used today?

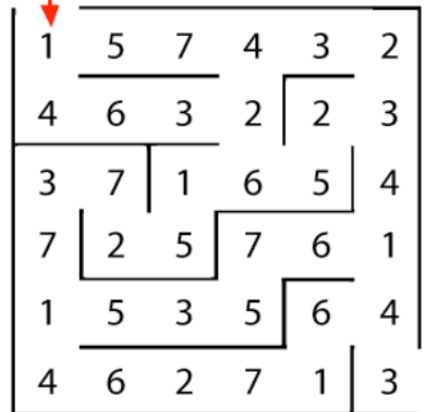
Task 5: Health & Wellbeing
