Transitions Principle: Entitlements

There is an underlying message in this story about having your voice heard. Every child is entitled to have their voice heard and to be valued and respected by others, under Article 12 of the UNCRC.

Things to do and explore

- Look at some non-fiction books and/or online resources to explore more about bears and what endangered means.
- Set up a STEM challenge in the construction/block area/outdoor loose parts and challenge the children to build a chair for the new knitted mice and for a teddy bear.

Support children's thinking and problem solving skills through interactions and questioning:

- I wonder what you will use to make your chair?
- How big would it need to be?
- I wonder who is heavier and how do we know?
- Will your chair be strong? How you will know?

Other Ideas

Support children's vestibular system by exploring how to move their bodies like a bear – try so bear yoga!

- What would you say and do if you were the mouse to get the bear to move?
- How were the bear and the mouse feeling at the end of the story?
- Did you think the story would end like that?
- If you were the bear would you share your chair?
