


















Curriculum for Excellence


Daily Organisation

- P.E. is currently on Monday and Tuesday.
- Children are required to wear shorts/leggings/jogging bottoms, a plain t-shirt and trainers to school on P.E days.
- Children will be asked to change top (at a minimum) once they have completed P.E. Please send children with a change of top (at a minimum).
- Please ensure children are coming to school with a jacket as we will take opportunities to be outside for learning opportunities.

Daily Organisation

- Phones will be locked in a box on arrival in school each day and will be collected at the end of the day.
- Chromebooks should be brought to school each day to ensure teaching and learning opportunities are maximised.
- Please ensure chromebooks come to school with a full charge, where possible.

All children in P1 -3 have access to their own iPad. All children in P4 - 7 have access to their own chromebook. This term we will have a focus on safe and responsible use of devices. Device will not be sent home until after the September weekend and only once Class Teachers feel children have a clear understanding of acceptable use of devices.

P4 - 7 Acceptable use agreement

For my own personal safety:

- I will treat my username and password like my toothbrush I will not share it, nor will I try to use any other person's username and password. I understand that I should not write down or store a password where it is possible that someone may steal it

I will act as I expect others to act toward me:


- I will respect others' work and property and will not access, copy, remove or otherwise alter any other user's files, without the owner's knowledge and permission
- I will be polite and responsible when I communicate with others, I will not use aggressive or inappropriate language and I appreciate that others may have different opinions.

- I understand that being a responsible digital citizen means that I have the same standards of relationships and behaviour in an online community as I do in the school community

When using the internet for research or fun, I know that:

- I should ensure that I have permission to use the original work of others in my own work
- Where work is protected by copyright, I will not try to download copies (including music and videos)
- When I am using the internet to find information, I will take care to check that the information that I access is accurate, as I understand that the work of others may not be truthful and may be a deliberate attempt to mislead me

<u>Digital Inclusion and Learning Team Device Repair/Replace Policy</u>

Damage to devices must be reported immediately to Sandra Scanlon, Mrs Knight or Mr Smith.

Pupils are responsible for

Keeping the device in its case

Not putting stickers or labels on the inside of chromebooks- this can damage the screen

Keeping the device away from water bottles and fluids at all times

Transporting the device safely and sensito school each day

Charging the device

Shutting down the device properly

Following all advice in the <u>Pupil Support</u> <u>Guides</u> Replacement devices (like-for-like) are supplied when:

- A device is faulty and the Troubleshooting Guide cannot resolve the fault
- Accidental damage occurs- reason for damage is required

Replacement devices **(non like-for-like)*** are supplied when:

- Malicious damage occurs
- Repeated irresponsible use occurs
 *typically older non-touch, non-flip models of device

Replacement devices not routinely supplied when:

- Keys have been picked off or removed- user should use onscreen keyboard
- Headphone jacks have been snapped in the device

Literacy

- Our current class novel is the 'Where the River Runs Gold'. We will be completing tasks to deepen our understanding of the setting, characters and plot by developing inferential, evaluative and deductive skills. We will be linking the novel study with the Sustainable Goals, where possible.
- . We also use **Accelerated Reader as a tool to support reading.** Children take an online quiz, and get immediate feedback.
- In writing, we will continue to follow the Talk for Writing approach where the children will learn literary techniques and language structures to uplevel their writing.
- In spelling, we are using the SWST progression to identify spelling rules and patterns appropriate for their level of ability.



Numeracy and Maths

We will continue to follow the **Midlothian progression** covering all aspects of maths and numeracy.

We will be using **concrete materials** (including dienes, counters, numicon, etc) and **pictorial representations** (such as the bar model) to provide a scaffold and support for learners during lessons.

Lessons throughout the week will have a Mathematics or Numeracy focus.

We will be working on the pupils' **application of numerical skills** across the curriculum, as well as areas of learning including **shape**, **measurement**, **algebra and statistics**.

We will also be further developing pupils' understanding of **number**, **place value**, **fractions**, **decimals and percentages and use of efficient methods for the four operations**.

Sumdog usernames and passwords will be checked and reissued as necessary to ensure we can utilise this resource. Other websites and resources for arithmetic practise at home can be provided if required.



Health and Wellbeing

- Daily check-in will be available for the children to complete.
- Discussions and activities surrounding resilience and its importance in their learning will be a focus this year.
- Each class will receive two lessons, weekly, with a PE specialist.
- The school values will be incorporated into our Health and Wellbeing lessons to further develop their understanding.
- We will continue to work through the RSHP progressions in the Summer term. There will be a letter nearer the time with more explanation and topics of conversation.
- There will be input from the School Nurse on the Headstrong Youth Programme, promoting positive mental wellbeing.
- In addition to the P7 Teachers and Learning Assistants, Miss Richmond
 is available to support pupils in the year group with any issues that
 they wish to discuss.



Topic Work

Throughout the year, children will explore a variety of topics, including World War.

This term we are considering Our Place in the World and learning about the Sustainable Development Goals.

Topics will be agreed upon with pupil input and will be shared through Home Learning.



Home Learning

Weekly

- Pupils will read for enjoyment at home and use the Fiction and Non-Fiction questions on Classroom to develop comprehension of texts.
- Pupils can practise maths through the use of Sumdog, as well as practising times tables
- Spelling words will be uploaded to the Classroom weekly for pupils. (This hasn't been done yet for P7 as we were at camp last week and I have let the pupils choose what words and sound patterns they are practising in preparation for an upcoming test.)

Termly

- There will be an IDL grid once a term. This term, the focus is on Democracy. It is expected that pupils will
 choose at least one activity from the grid to focus on: developing the skills suggested based on what we will
 be working on in class. For example: identifying things that need to be improved within the local community
 and writing a letter to the local councillor.
- Pupils can however choose to complete more activities if they wish. Time will be given in class for pupils to
 present their learning from their chosen activity.
- Dates for terms can be found on the PowerPoint.

Annually

- Life skills grid complete as many activities
- Non-Fiction and Fiction questions to be put onto Classroom to guide reading for enjoyment
- Suggestions for practising spelling in the format of 50 ways to learn spellings.

Home learning will begin after the September weekend (w/b 19th of September)

Any other info....

This year, there will be several trips and opportunities for children. Dates and information will be communicated in time.

These include:

- Quiz Night: Thursday 12th October
- Risk Factory: Dates TBC
- Burns Brunch: January/February (Dates TBC)
- School Camp: Monday 29th April 1st May
- Leavers events (inc. Assembly): Dates toc
- There may be more!
 - There will be a Year Book presented to children at the end of the year. More information to come.




