All Classes use The Zones of Regulation to help our learners describe their emotions.







Curriculum


At The Wee Brae, we plan the learning to meet the strengths and needs of our learners.

We use CfE Guidelines, alongside Complex Needs and Foundation Milestones as appropriate.









Curriculum

In all classes, learning is planned to cover Literacy, Numeracy and Maths, and Health and Wellbeing Outcomes.

In **Literacy**, there a focus on communication skills, alongside developing reading and writing skills at the appropriate level.

In **Numeracy and Maths**, there is a focus on core numeracy skills and using Maths in real life contexts.

In **Health and Wellbeing**, there a focus on emotional regulation and targeted input to support individual targets.

All learning is enhanced through purposeful play experiences, both indoors and outdoors.

All classes have PE lessons timetabled in the gym hall and on the outside Astro turf.

Raising Attainment


We are proud our all our learners and celebrate all their achievements. We recognise that seemingly small steps can be huge leaps for our learners.

Communication



At The Wee Brae we use Seesaw to share updates on learning and information specific to The Wee Brae.

Your child's Learning Journal on Seesaw can only be seen by school staff and any family members who have been given the access code.

Families are welcome to leave a note on their child's journal if they have a non urgent question or information to share with school staff.

School staff use Seesaw from 8:30am - 5:00pm. Staff will reply to any comments within these hours. Any questions for staff posted during teaching time, may not be replied to until the end of the school day.



If you have more than one child using Seesaw, you may find it easier to login as a family member. This will allow you to switch between accounts.





Learning through and with digital technology



To keep our digital devices safe in school, we support our learners to follow these guidelines.

- ★ I will ask a grown up if I want to use my device.
- ★ I will follow instructions when I use my device.
- ★ I will take care of my device and other equipment.
- ★ I will ask for help if I am not sure what to do.
- \star I will tell a trusted adult if I see something that upsets me on the screen.

Using digital technology safely

For my own personal safety:

- I will treat my username and password like my toothbrush I will not share it, nor will I try to use any otl... person's username and password. I understand that I should not write down or store a password where it is possible that someone may steal it
- I will not share personal information about myself or others when I'm online
- I will tell and adult that I trust if I see any unpleasant or inappropriate material or messages or anything that makes me feel uncomfortable

I will act as I expect others to act toward me:

- I will respect others' work and property and will not access, copy, remove or otherwise alter any other user's files, without the owner's knowledge and permission
- I will be polite and responsible when I communicate with others, I will not use aggressive or inappropriate language and I appreciate that others may have different opinions.
- I will not take or share images of anyone without their permission
- I understand that being a responsible digital citizen means that I have the same standards of relationships and behaviour in an online community as I do in the school community

When using the internet for research or fun, I know that:

- I should ensure that I have permission to use the original work of others in my own work
- Where work is protected by copyright, I will not try to download copies (including music and videos)
- When I am using the internet to find information, I will take care to check that the information that I access is
 accurate, as I understand that the work of others may not be truthful and may be a deliberate attempt to
 mislead me

<u>Digital Inclusion and Learning Team Device Repair/Replace Policy</u>

Damage to devices must be reported immediately to Sandra Scanlon, Mrs Knight or Mr Smith.

Pupils are responsible for

Keeping the device in its case

Not putting stickers or labels on the inside of chromebooks- this can damage the screen

Keeping the device away from water bottles and fluids at all times

Transporting the device safely and sensito school each day

Charging the device

Shutting down the device properly

Following all advice in the <u>Pupil Support</u> <u>Guides</u>

Replacement devices (like-for-like) are supplied when:

- A device is faulty and the Troubleshooting Guide cannot resolve the fault
- Accidental damage occurs- reason for damage is required

Replacement devices **(non like-for-like)*** are supplied when:

- Malicious damage occurs
- Repeated irresponsible use occurs*typically older non-touch, non-flip models of device

Replacement devices not routinely supplied when:


- Keys have been picked off or removed- user should use onscreen keyboard
- Headphone jacks have been snapped in the device






Please:

- o Contact the school office via email if you need to make an appointment or ask any questions
- o Ask your child about their learning
- o Encourage your child to organise themselves
- o Ensure all clothing is clearly labelled
- o Ensure no personal belongings are brought from home except for lunch boxes, snacks and water bottles
- o Download Seesaw and the school app









Parking

All official school transport (taxi's and mini-buses) drop pupils off in our delivery drop-off zone at the main Burnbrae Early door. As school transport use the delivery area, it is imperative that parents do not use this area for drop-off/parking. We are part of the School Streets scheme and signage is on display in Chester's Court.

Remember parking is readily available at the pavilion car park (by the rugby club) with a School Crossing Guide sited on Rosewell Road to get them across to the school side if you/your child are able enough to walk from there.
