



### Apply for a P1 school place


Your child can start school in August 2024 if their fifth birthday is between 1 March 2023 and 29 February 2025.

If your child is due to start Primary 1 in August 2024, they must be registered at their catchment school. Letters were sent on 6 November 2023 for children attending a Midlothian Council funded Early Learning setting or partnership nursery. The letter confirmed your catchment school. If your letter did not arrive, or your child does not attend a Midlothian Council funded setting or nursery, email

Our P5 classes enjoyed a microscopy workshop run by a team of scientists from Edinburgh University. They learned how to use a variety of microscopes and had an opportunity to ask questions about the wider world of science too.

Mrs Roberts and Mrs Lawrie have attended training at Edinburgh University to learn about an exciting rail project that has been organised in partnership with Primary Engineer Programmes. The project will be a collaborative learning experience between pupils in P3A and P7C which will allow children to work together while developing, consolidating and expanding STEM skills and knowledge.

### **STEM**



Primary 6 have enjoyed participating in a STEM themed escape room this month. Their mission was to solve a range of puzzles which included maths, circuits and programming problems to find the combination and crack the code.







Primary 7 were delighted to have a recent visit from Tom Lucas. Tom and his company, Mott MacDonald, have supported the school significantly and last year donated a large amount of K'Nex Kits for our children to enjoy. Tom led the learning in P7 with three STEM based workshops; Think Like An Engineer, What Is Engineering and STEM space challenge. The Primary 7 children also enjoyed the use of a VR headset to encourage them to learn more about the wider world of work within engineering.

You may be aware of the literacy toolbar Read&Write. We use this toolbar in school to support learning and it is installed on all pupil iPads and Chromebooks.
