Well done to all Primary 3A and P7C pupils who have engaged in the Primary Engineer rail project this session. The classes worked collaboratively to create working locomotives, a selection of which were then showcased at a celebration event hosted by Edinburgh University.

During the event, the children were interviewed by a panel of engineers about their build and their design. They were given the challenge of test driving their locomotives around a series of challenges including, safely navigating obstacles, moving up and down ramps, navigating straight lines and their ability to tow loads of varying weights. The celebration was rounded off with a special award ceremony which celebrated the hard work and achievement of all the young engineers. Kiara and Ada were awarded an 'excellent communication skills' medal and all participants were recognised with a participation certificate.'

















The Conkers and Clovers had a visit from Miss Hutton, a Chemist from St Andrews University.

The children did some practical investigations using chromatography, oxidation and hydrophobicity. Families will have to ask their children what these mean!











Infection Control



Common medical conditions which require absence from school/nursery:

- . Sickness/Diarrhea 48 hours after last bout has occurred
- . Chickenpox until spots are dry
- Fifth disease ('Slapped-cheek') one day after the onset of the rash
- Strep A 24 hours after appropriate antibiotics
- Hand Foot and Mouth Disease until blisters have healed
- Scarlet Fever 24 hours after treatment is started
- Whooping Cough 48 hours after appropriate antibiotics

Parents/carers, please note to the left a reminder of the exclusion criteria for common medical conditions.

In the event that you have any questions about a condition that your child is suffering from, please contact the school office.

The office staff monitor outbreaks of all medical conditions which we are notified of, and liaise with Pubic Health Scotland as required.
