Literacy Reading

We will turn our attention to reading non fiction relating to our topic Mary Queen of Scots. In addition we will look at unseen texts in First News articles and work on strategies to use in reading comprehension tasks.

Writing

We hope to produce a variety of different writing genres including newspaper articles, instructions and leaflets.

<u>Listening and Talking</u> Circle times will continue along with presentations on our current topic.

Numeracy and Maths

We will continue to look at addition and subtraction of larger numbers as well as the relationship between repeated addition, grouping and arrays in multiplication. Our weekly maths challenges will continue, to improve our speed and accuracy in our mental maths and tables.

Health and Wellbeing

We will continue to look at the components of the Health and Wellbeing wheel and use circle time to discuss what these mean and how they are addressed in school and at home. These do raise some sensitive issues at times. Children will be directed to ask any questions or raise any issues within a private 'bubble time'. In PE, we will practise our basketball skills: dribbling, passing and shooting. This will be

supplemented with our weekly swimming.
