Home Learning Grid - Term 2 2020

<p>Literacy - Reading</p> <p>In class we have been developing a range of comprehension skills, including understanding unfamiliar words and summarising a text.</p> <p>Using a book of your choice, write a summary of what happens in a chapter of your book (or in the whole book if it is a short book). You should do this after reading the chapter/ book. Remember a summary should be brief and contain the main points. You can write your summary in your jotter.</p> <p>As you read, note down any unfamiliar words you come across. See if you can work out the meaning of the word by reading around it in the text. Check your understanding with an adult afterwards by telling them about the book.</p>	<p>Literacy - Writing</p> <p>In class we have been learning about using descriptive writing to bring the setting and characters to life.</p> <p>Write a short story that focuses on one or two characters and vividly describes the setting in which the action takes place.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For characters remember to describe what they look like as well as their personalities. • For the settings remember to bring in the 5 senses to help with your descriptions - <i>see, hear, smell, taste & touch.</i> 	<p>Numeracy / Maths</p> <p>Log onto Sumdog and try to play for 15-20 minutes as often as you can.</p> <p>A competition has been set up which covers many of the numeracy and maths topics that have been covered so far in primary 5/6.</p> <p>This will be good revision and practise and will include questions on addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, money, and time, shape and pattern.</p> <p>The competition will run through to December so you have plenty of time to <i>have a go.</i></p>
<p>HWB</p> <p>In class we have spent lots of time thinking about being kind to ourselves and each other. We have developed our class charter and understand our expectations around behaviour and learning.</p> <p>Now it's time to spread some kindness at home. Design and make a card for someone in your family that you really care about. Make your card colourful and make sure you include a message that let's then know why you think they're so special.</p> <p>Enjoy this task and have fun doing it, an amazing effort will make someone very happy 😊</p>	<p>Learning Across the Curriculum - Art & Design</p> <p>We have learned lots of skills in art recently - <i>drawing in 3D, shading, figures, textures, painting with watercolour and using paper for models and to create silhouettes.</i></p> <p>Use one or more of these skills to create your own artwork at home. You could do anything - a winter scene, a monster, a giant, you could make a portrait of someone at home, design a new front cover for your favourite book, etc - but make sure you try to apply the skills you have learnt in class in your new artwork.</p>	<p>Learning Across the Curriculum - Sciences</p> <p>Earlier this session we learnt about <i>Animal Adaptations</i> in a series of science lessons.</p> <p>Log-in to Education City where I have set some further activities for you to explore.</p> <p>You don't have to do all of them, but there is no set order so dip into the different tasks and see what you can remember from our previous sessions.</p> <p>The tasks are located in the homework tab called <i>Animal Adaptations</i> and are available right through to December.</p>
