## Head Teacher's Update

Dear Parent/Carer,

The past six weeks have been a whirlwind. It's hard to believe that this time last year I was being interviewed by staff, pupils and parents for the Head Teacher post at Dalkeith High School. It has been an absolute pleasure to be welcomed into this school community and I have relished the challenge and opportunities presented to me every day. In fact, the past couple of weeks have reminded me why I am in education. I have had the absolute privilege to watch our young people in S2, present to their peer group about their chosen charity, for the chance to win them £3000 through the Youth and Philanthropy Initiative. I was blown away by the creativity and confidence displayed on the day. This week our music pupils have been showcasing their talent at a range of different concerts. I attended the Young Musician of the Year and was delighted to see Mia Linn awarded with second prize for her performance on the night. As many of you will also know our U15 Girls Campus football team had their final league fixture last Wednesday. They won 9-1 which means they have won the league and kept their unbeaten run intact. Well done to all!

Last Friday we welcomed 15 Norwegian teachers to our school. They were given a real Dalkeith welcome with Lewis Allison piping them in to our school. They were blown away by our broad curriculum which offers something for everyone. They loved taking part in lessons across the school and commented on how engaged our learners were in their lessons. It was great to share our experiences and learn from our Norwegian counterparts. We hope to welcome them back soon.

As we draw to the end of term 2 we are starting to think about next year and the improvements we want to make for next session. We want to ensure our expectations of pupils and staff are high and as such we are improving some of our policies across the school. This survey will be open until the 17th of April.

We have some staff moving on to pastures new after the Easter holidays. Rachel Hamilton, Maths teacher leaves us to join a school in England. While Jason Moncrieff, Physics Teacher, is also leaving us to relocate to Ireland. We wish them both the best for their new roles. Please be reassured that our faculties have plans I place to support all classes from S1-S6. Supported study sessions are planned for the run up to the exams and as such no pupil should be disadvantaged as a result of news above. Interviews for these posts are imminent.

After the holidays our focus will be on our SQA exams. Study leave will start on Monday 24th April and I hope that pupils use the time between now and the start of the exam diet to focus on their revision. I would encourage pupils to take part in the Easter revision classes that are taking place across the two week break to support them in their preparation.



Social Security Scotland's Local Delivery service in Midlothian are now holding drop in 'information sessions' across Midlothian on a monthly basis. The next session at Dalkeith Library is 11th April 10:00 – 13:00 and subsequently the second Tuesday of every month going forward. These sessions aim to raise awareness of the benefits Social Security Scotland deliver and also offer advice on how to apply. The main SQA examination diet will run from Monday 24th April to Wednesday 31st May inclusive. Arrangements for Study Leave this session are as follows:

- S4 Pupils with 3 or more National 5 Examinations and all S5/S6 pupils will have full Study Leave running from Monday 24th
  April to Wednesday 31st May Inclusive. Young people do need not need to attend school unless they have an examination
  or wish to attend a study session confirmed by their teacher through Google Classroom. Other times should be spent
  productively completing home study.
- S4 Pupils with 1 or 2 examinations will be entitled to the 2 school days prior to each examination as Study Leave. Young people who fall into this category should attend the Employability Programme being offered in the school at all other times. More information regarding this programme will follow in due course.
- S4 Pupils who do not have any formal exams should follow the Employability Programme. During the examination period these pupils will also be able to complete any remaining coursework/assessments to allow these qualifications to be achieved.

#### **Exceptional Circumstances**

In the event that a young person is unable to attend an exam in exceptional situations, contact should be made to the school on the day of the exam before 8:40am. In some cases the Examination Exceptional Circumstances Consideration Service (EECCS) will support young people who are unable to attend an exam. This service will be available for young people in the exceptional situations listed below:

- A young person has been unable to attend an exam, or prevented from completing the exam, due to a personal circumstance beyond their control (such as a medical issue).
- A young person has been impacted during an exam by a disruption or another exam circumstance reported by the chief invigilator.
- A young person's performance in the exam was impacted by a personal circumstance, or an unplanned incident on the day which was beyond their control.

A request to this service must be submitted within 10 days after the exam therefore absence or other disruption must be reported to the school on the day of the exam. We will then provide alternative assessment evidence to the SQA. SQA examiners will review this along with any exam materials that a young person completed to decide a grade.

#### **Appeals**

Appeals 2023 is a free service that a young person can use if they have genuine concerns about a grade. This year's appeal service will have a different process to the one used last year as alternative assessment evidence will not be looked it. This year if a young person appeals against their grade, a senior marker will carry out a marking review of their SQA-marked assessments. Please note, this is not a re-mark.

#### A marking review checks that:

- All parts of an assessment have been marked.
- The marking is in line with national standards.
- The marks given for each answer have been totalled correctly.
- The correct result has been entered on SQA systems.

A young person should discuss their decision to appeal as soon as possible after getting their results. Please note that after being reviewed, result could stay the same, go up or go down. More information is available at www.sqa.org.uk/appeals. Please note that a letter confirming this information along with a copy of your young person's timetable and other SQA information will be sent to you the week beginning the 3rd April.
