DofE Gold Expedition

The Gold Duke of Edinburgh's Award participants completed their assessment expedition from the 3rd - 6th June through the beautiful Great Glen. The group started at Dores on the shores of Loch Ness. It was a flat calm day and and the sun was shining - absolutely perfect conditions for canoeing. After a fairly relaxed start the wind soon picked up which made for more challenging conditions on Loch Ness. Despite the winds and the rough waters the group made it to their first campsite at Foyers where they had a lovely evening enjoying the sun by the lochside. The next day saw the group heading for the end of the Loch and Fort Augustus. Again it was a really windy day which created some extremely challenging canoeing conditions along the loch. Everyone did fantastically well and powered on through despite the large swell on the loch! Having reached Fort Augustus the team portaged their canoes to the top of the locks then headed onto the final stretch of the day before camping in the trees at Kytra. Day three saw the group up early for what was to be the longest of the expedition. After a very pleasant paddle along the canal section the group were soon at Lagan and then onto Loch Lochy. Again the wind was blowing but at least it was at their backs so it didn't take too long to paddle the 15km or so down to their last wild campsite at Clunes. After a final night under canvas and brilliant bonfire on the lochside beach, the group set off on their final day - heading for Fort William. After completing the final section of Loch Lochy the group were back on the canal for the home stretch. Another beautiful section of canal was to follow before finally completing the expedition at the top of Neptune's Staircase. A truly incredible achievement and one which will surely live on in the memories of these intrepid explorers for years to come! Well done everybody and we look forward to seeing you all at Holyrood Palace when you will formally receive your awards!


Owen Carlisle (formally S6) features in the creative exhibition as his work was selected as exceptional practice by the SQA.
