Head Teacher's Update



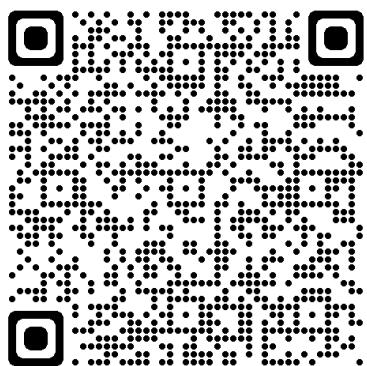
P7 Parents Evening Thursday 26 October

Support coping with rising living costs



Dear Parent/Carer,

Our focus, since I last wrote, has been centred on rights respecting schools. Our staff training session last week focused on how we deliver a rights based approach in the classroom. Staff reflected on approaches which celebrate dignity, pupil participation and social justice. The time for reflection was invaluable to ensuring we refocus our efforts to ensure our approaches in and out of the classroom are rights focused.

We have also set up a pupil working group to focus on this area of school development. This week I met with BGE pupils to discuss our toilet facilities around the school. Pupils are keen to work with the school to ensure these shared facilities are improved for all. I really valued my time with this group of young people, and they should be very proud of what they have achieved so far.

At the start of this week our school assemblies focused on challenge poverty week. Pupils took part in whole school surveys which highlighted to them the increased need across Scotland but also our school community. Pupils were reminded about:

- The essentials hubs which are placed around our school. These are stocked with stationery, sanitary products, hygiene products and snacks. This is available for all pupils at any point of the day.
- We also run a breakfast club which is open for all pupils. This starts at 8am and is very well attended by our pupil body.
- This year we will continue to run our Christmas present appeal within the school and our prom wear shop.

We hope that all of this will help in some small way to take the stigma away from poverty. Our whole school working group are continuing to plan new ways that we can challenge poverty and there will be more news on this soon.

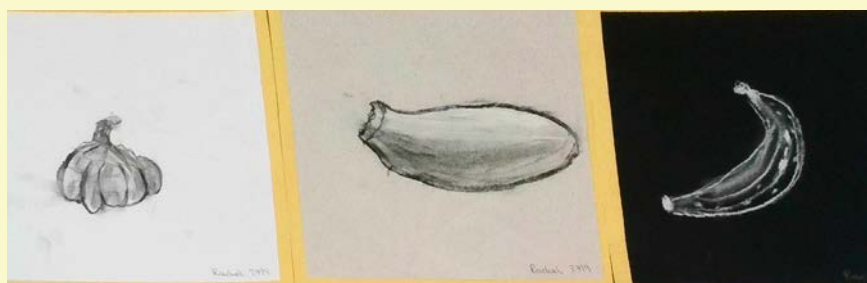

Once again, the Maths Department ran several activities for Maths Week at the end of September.

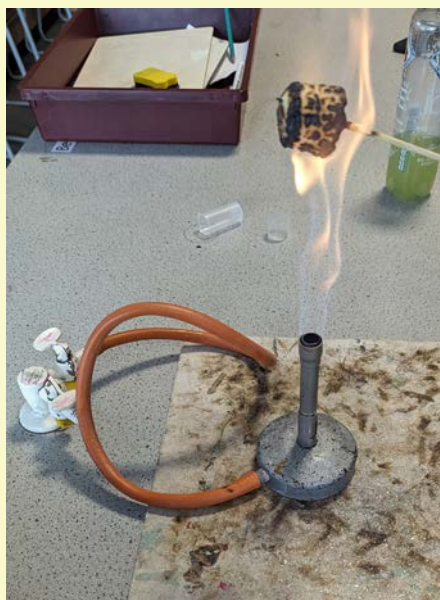
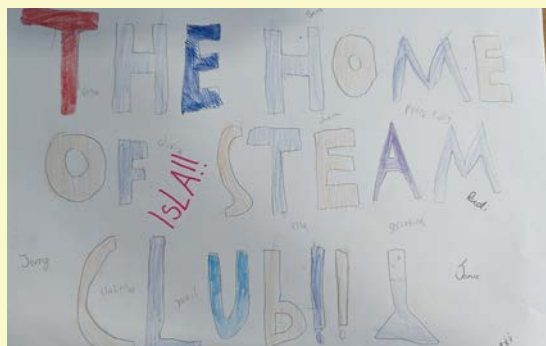
S1 pupils were honing their probability/chance and statistics skills, starting with the chance to guess (and win) the jar of sweets:

DofE Silver Practice Expedition

The Silver Duke of Edinburgh group set off on their practice expedition last week in the Lammermuir Hills. Starting in Lauder on Thursday morning, the groups travelled across various terrain to make it to Stenton, over 20 miles away three days later. Day one started off with a fresh breeze, but the threat of rain was soon on the horizon. The groups battled hard to stay ahead of the wall of cloud the was fast approaching. It was only during the last few kilometres where the groups were caught in strong winds and driving rain, but thankfully the rain eased as they headed off the hill and into camp for night one. After setting up their tents and filling their bellies, the groups settled down in front of the campfire for some marshmallows and star-gazing in the beautifully clear night sky.

The next morning the groups were up at 7 o'clock, ready for the day ahead. After getting out of camp at 9, they headed out for the next leg of their expedition. The groups soon arrived at Hopes estate and headed for the hills. The new challenge for the groups this year was tackling the hill ascents, with the biggest coming on day two. The groups persevered and after what felt like an age, made it up to well over 500m carrying their heavily laden packs. Next the groups faced a long walk along a valley, however a series of stream crossings swollen with water from recent rain would make things interesting. The groups pushed on and with the odd wet foot, managed to get into camp for their second and final night. Thinking the biggest challenge was out the way, the groups cooked, socialised and relaxed... until....

The rain started at about half past 6 and didn't stop until Sunday afternoon (thankfully everyone was home and warm by then). The campsite flooded overnight, Mr Duncan and Mr Pyper and many others woke up in puddles 2 inches deep. Some people even had to relocate their tents in the middle of the night to try to prevent water seeping in further. Everyone woke up to heavy, relentless downpours that were to be the theme of the day. With very little left to soak through, the groups trudged through the bog and deep puddles to complete the last 9km of their expedition. Some were so desperate for the end, they were wading through puddles almost knee deep. One by one the gorups made it safely into Stenton, where everyone quickly disbanded to the safety of their cars.

A massive well done to everyone who braved these difficult conditions. We're looking forward to getting out on our Silver Assessment in the Trossachs next year where (fingers crossed) there won't be any rain although, there may be a midge or two....

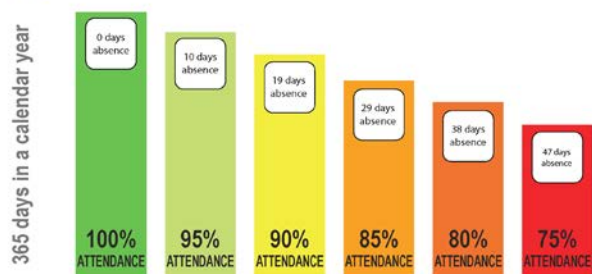

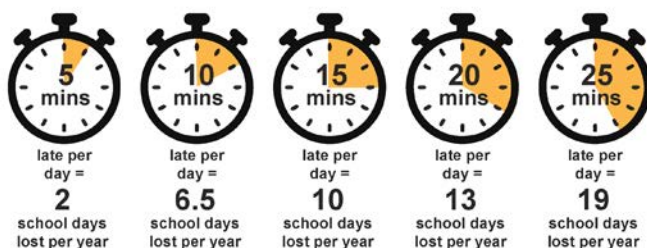
