I know it probably seems like a long time since the October holiday but I hope you all had a restful break with family and friends. Since then, all staff engaged in a training session with ADHD UK, to help us develop strategies to support young people who are diagnosed or who have neurodiverse traits. This professional development will continue throughout the year as we practise the strategies we learnt on the day.

On Thursday last week we welcomed all of our P7 parents and young people. Each faculty shared curricular information and throughout the evening there were a number of learning experiences which P7 pupils could take part in. It was brilliant to see the enthusiasm from our current S1 as they showed off their school. Our S1 pupils also led P7 pupils through science experiments, football sessions, cooking and more. The night was supported by our senior pupils who took parents and pupils on a tour of the school. I want to thank all parents/carers and P7 pupils for attending. We are looking forward to welcoming you back for more transition events across the year.

On Monday of this week we had our first quality assurance visit of the year. This focused on leadership of change and self-evaluation for self-improvement. We shared developments around our raising attainment and attendance strategy. The review team gave positive feedback about

the pace of change in the school and could see evidence of impact on young people as a result of our new strategies. I am delighted with the outcome of this visit and will continue to work hard with staff, pupils and parents to continue to make important improvements in Dalkeith High School.

We ended that Monday on an even bigger high, with the S1 Halloween disco. This event was organised by our School Captains and House Captains. They arranged music and games for the night. They put in a huge amount of effort to make decorations and without doubt it was a great success.

We are currently in the process of organising our careers and curriculum evening for the 21st of November. We have a huge number of representatives from universities, colleges, industry and more, coming on the night. Our own staff will also be available to explain curricular pathways and employability opportunities within their subject area. This evening is open to all pupils and parents and I would encourage you to attend. See further details in this bulletin.
