

Dear Parent/Carer,

As I mentioned in my last newsletter we have been holding a number of interviews this week to fill new and existing roles within the school. See the new appointments below:


- Kirsty McCole has been appointed as pupil Support Leader to Melville house. She will replace Mrs McDermott while she is on her secondment.

Finally, I want to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year for 2024.



In the Classroom ...












