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

Head Teacher's Update

Dear Parent/Carer,

It's hard to believe that we have reached the SQA exam period already. I hope that the exams, which started this week, have gone well for our learners. It has been great to have our Seniors in school this week, working hard on their revision and preparations for their exams. As you know, exam leave starts on Monday 29th April and ends on 29th May. For those learners who do not have exam leave, there is a full Meaningful May programme in place for these young people. It is essential that pupils attend these sessions.

After exam leave, S4 pupils who are returning for S5 and S5 pupils who are returning to S6 will take part in an induction day before the start of the new timetable. The new S6 induction day will take place on Thursday 30th May and the new S5 induction day will take place on Friday the 31st May. A letter will follow with an outline of each induction day.

MYPAS Charity Running Event – free entry to young people

There are a 10k and 5k trail runs and a children's 1k run – all in the beautiful surroundings of Dalkeith Country Park. More information on the Bluebell website: https://www.bluebelltrail.co.uk/

This year the event is taking place at the start of Mental Health Awareness Week (13th-19th May) and, appropriately, the theme this year is "Movement: Moving more for our mental health".

It is an inclusive event, as well as adult participation, it is open to children and young people of all abilities, to engage children in activity to improve mental health, wellbeing and physical fitness. We hope the experience encourages them to seek out subsequent regular activity, parkrun, athletic clubs, engagement with events organised by the Active Schools service, enjoyment of free open spaces, and so on. Children of 11 and older can enter the 5k and children of 15 and over can enter the 10k. Adults can enter the 5k and 10k. We also have a 1k junior race for children 10 and under (free entry for adults accompanying them).

Entry is free for children attending East Lothian, Midlothian and Gala Academy High Schools and we encourage schools to enter teams of children and young people, staff, parents and carers, healthy competition always welcome!

Our under 14s tournament will take place on Friday 26th April at 2.15pm at our Campus. We will let you know how they get on in their first competitive outing!


Under 15s

Harry Falconer 6L1 was selected for the Scotland under 18 Basketball team and assigned the role of Captain! He played in the four nations tournament this month in Dundee.




