Bronze:Rights committed. We have begun working towards achieving our Silver award and will be working with our Rights Respecting steering group to create an action plan.


<u>Seesaw</u>

Primary 1 news

Primary 2 have been enjoying our current IDL topic which has been exploring Scotland's past. They have been working on comparing the past to our present life. Through their learning they have spent some time looking at ancient artefacts and working out what we can learn about from them. The children became very interested in castles and specifically how they are built to protect those inside from invasion. We have also been sharing stories from Scotland's past and have particularly enjoyed the tale of Greyfriars Bobby!













Primary 3 news

Primary 3 have recently enjoyed learning about our local area and have been discussing how Danderhall has changed over time. The children have shown a keen interest in learning about Danderhall as a mining town and enjoyed sharing stories about their families involvement in the mines. We have also been learning about changes to the land use in Danderhall. The children have been comparing maps of the local area and discussing how Danderhall has grown and changed over time. We used the Magnificent Map resources provided by the GeoBus to create maps of the local area.



Primary 4 news



Primary 4 have been continuing to enjoy our swimming lessons on a Friday morning. We have gained so much confidence in the water, and improved our swimming strokes and techniques too.

Both P4 classes also recently held a Family Ceilidh to celebrate and share our learning in Scottish Country Dancing. It was lovely to see so many families coming together and joining in the dances.





Primary 5 news

Primary 5 have been learning about historical events in Edinburgh and their local area during the 16th and 17th century. Pupils have explored events such as The Plague and Witch Trials along with learning about key figures such as Burke and Hare. Both classes have researched and written articles about these events and have also created Plague



Doctor masks and exploding buboes. The children demonstrated a keen interest in their history and were able to make connections between The Plague and Covid-19.

Primary 6 news



Our P6 pupils have been learning about The Jacobites and what life was like in Scotland back in the 17th & 18th centuries. Pupils have been learning about the different key figures and events of the rebellions and learning about the gory history of massacres and battles. P6A have extended their understanding of how to interpret maps and use this to find places and features within our country

and the rest of the world. P6B have been working together to research interesting information to create their own website. They look forward to sharing this with their parents soon.

Primary 7 news

P7s have begun a new system in P7 called Classroom Economy. This system is to support pupils to achieve the 4 capacities of the Curriculum for Excellence.

Pupils have been allocated jobs and responsibilities in order to achieve positive goals. Please discuss with your child what this involves and what their responsibilities are. For example - Homework is due on Tuesday and that is a responsibility that will allow them to achieve one of their goals.

Lauchlan Trainer has been selected to play for the Scotland under 13s national team for the full season. As part of this, they are travelling to Bratislava in Slovakia to compete in the EMF international tournament against the best club sides from that region. This is from 30th April until 5th May.

They will also be playing an international series match vs England, in Dumfries on the weekend of the 8th and 9th of June.



QI Visit

On Thursday 22nd February, a team of Quality Improvement Managers and Officers came to Danderhall Primary to find out about our Learning, Teaching and Assessment improvement journey. Throughout the day the team observed teachers, spoke to pupils and staff focus groups. The team were very positive about the improvements and were very complimentary about how articulate our pupils were.

The key strengths included

- 1. Children who were keen, polite and respectful.
- 2. Nurturing relationships between children and staff
- 3. Displays of pupils work in corridor areas and developing use of atrium spaces for planned learning
- Clear sense of collegiality across staff groups
- 5. Staff who were positive and fully on board with changes and keen to embed these.
- 6. Staff who valued the permanent changes to SLT and the clear remits of the team and the support given.
