Reminder for Parents/Pupils

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
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Read & Write Champions

Some of our P7's had to make an emergency phone call to the coast guard and to the fire service when under pressure in a challenging situation.










P7 Midlothian Stem Competition

P7 pupils participated in a Midlothian Engineering Design Competition 'The Rescuers.' Pupils worked hard to study, plan, design and build their own rescue vehicle. Three rescue vehicles were then chosen from each P7 class to be entered into the competition. The selected vehicles were taken to the National Mining Museum for judging. Our competition entries were on display at the National Mining Museum week commencing 9/5/23 and the exhibition was open to the public Monday 8/5/23 to Thursday 11/5/23. All Primary 7 pupils were given the opportunity to attend the exhibition to view and discuss all of the creative and unique designs, Taking part in the project enabled pupils to develop and learn new science and technology skills and use new resources. Pupils learned about levers, pulleys and gears, discussed and learned more about people who work in STEM professions and were given opportunities to research types of engineers. Pupils also learned to use our new Vex Go STEM resources. Initially, pupils were challenged to build a Supercar, a Hexbug and a few created a functioning litter picker. Pupils then had the choice to use the Vex Go resources, adapt the motorised vehicle that they had already created or use other resources of their choice (recycling materials, Lego Spike etc.) to build their rescue vehicle/machine. The last task was to look at examples of Top Trump cards for rescue machines and create a Top Trump Card for their rescue vehicle/machine. A very memorable and exciting project to have been involved in.



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Sports Day

Our Gorebridge Primary School Sports Day took place on Wednesday 7th June 2023. It was an exciting and busy day with lots of families and friends spectating and encouraging our athletes.

Participants competed in their classes and represented their Houses wearing house colours; Borthwick – Blue, Crichton – Red, Newbyres – Yellow. The weather stayed fair and allowed the upper school sports to take place in the morning and the P1 - P4sports to take place in the afternoon. We would like to thank all of the families and friends who attended this event. It was a very close finish once all of the points were added.

On Thursday 22nd and Friday 23rd of June Mr Wood, Miss Mack, Miss Murray and children were filmed as part of a case study. Midlothian Council asked our school (the only Primary school) to participate in a Read and Write video case study. The video will be used to share publically how Read and Write is being used in Midlothian schools. This video will be used nationally and internationally to promote the "universal by design" approach Midlothian have taken as a local authority to ensure all young people can make best use of the Read and Write toolbar. Read and Write as you may know is a learning toolbar, built into all Chromebooks and iPads in Midlothian. It is used in our school to support learners with study skills, literacy and to help organize learning. The completed video will be shared with you after the summer holidays.
