- P1 and ELC continue to work closely






Curriculum for Excellence (CfE)


Life in P1

- Child-led and play based learning similar to ELC
- Whole class teaching, group and individual teaching and continuous provision
- Opportunities to develop independence and self-help skills
- Strong communication links between home and school
- Seesaw to share learning and information



Glenable

- Similar to ELC/P1 set up with play based learning and short targeted teaching moments.
- Focus points include: life skills programmes, gaining independence and accessing the community safely.
- Safe Space "Green Room", kitchen, sensory room all available to use to support regulation/learning.
- Class sizes max 8, generally with 1 teacher & 2 support staff.

Entering the School

Break and Lunch

- Bring a healthy snack (nut free)
- Milk can be ordered in August
- School dinners are free for P1s



- Menu available on the website (order forms issued in due course)
- Bring your own healthy packed lunch if you would prefer
- Fruit offered daily during lunch
- Buddy system to help and support P1's in classroom/dinner hall and playground
- Staff in the playground and classroom/dining hall



What if my child is unwell?

- Please do not send your child to school if they are unwell. If your child is sick, the school policy is 48 hours before they return.
- Telephone the school by 9am
- If you don't phone, we MUST text and/or phone to establish the reason for absence
- If your child becomes unwell at school, a member of staff will contact you to discuss





What if my child has medication?

- Staff are trained in Emergency First Aid
- Consent forms
 - Regular medication e.g. inhaler
 - Self-administered medication see the office staff





What Should My Child Wear?

 Uniform - black trousers/skirt/shorts/ tunic, white/black polo top, Gore Glen jumper/cardigan/hoodie, green and white check dress, black shoes (Velcro)

How Can You Support Us?

- Encourage your child to get dressed independently and put on shoes by themselves over the summer holidays
- Independent self help skills such as toileting
- Ensure the school has up-to-date contact details
- Make sure everything is labelled
- Come along to our Parent Council meetings.





What Can I Expect from School?

- Informal discussions with the class teacher before or at end of school day if necessary
- 2 Parent Consultation appointments per year (Oct/March)
- Written Progress Report in June

- Any questions or concerns can be shared with the admin team by phone or email and they will be passed on to the correct member of the teaching or leadership team.
