School Uniform

Parents/ Carers are asked to follow the school dress code for their child. All children should be appropriately dressed for school and equipped for the changing weather. We encourage pupils to change into gym rubbers when they are in school.

To help on gym days please encourage your child to wear clothing which is easy to change - not a shirt and tie! Also no jewellery. If ear-rings are worn then please provide surgical tape to secure them to prevent injury.

You can wear;

- ✓ A royal blue school sweatshirt or jumper/cardigan
- ✓ A white/blue polo shirt
- √ Navy/ black/ grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- ✓ Blue checked dress in the summer
- ✓ All children should wear black/ navy shoes

If you are in receipt of certain benefits and your child is entitled to a clothing grant please complete the online form on the Midlothian website - www.midlothian.gov.uk



We ask that all school clothes are clearly marked with the pupils' name.

Change of Clothes

Please supply your child with a change of clothes. This should come to school in a plastic bag labelled with your child's name and can be kept on their peg in case they have an accident. It is fine for these clothes to be non-uniform.

P.E. Kit

For P.E. children must come to school with a pair of trainers or gym shoes, shorts and t-shirt in a P.E. bag to be used for this purpose. Each child will be allocated a school house team and are welcome to wear their colour during P.E. Please contact our school office if you wish to order a house colour PE kit which consists of a gym bag, black shorts and house colour t-shirt. It would be helpful if you could dress your child (on P.E. days) in easy clothes to change into (e.g. socks instead of tights, no school tie, polo shirt rather than shirt, etc.) Perhaps you could practise dressing/undressing prior to starting school. A wee holiday project!

Shoes that your child can fasten without the help of an adult would be greatly appreciated. Your child's P.E. kit should be in school at all times and will be sent home at the end of every term to be washed.

School Bag

At Hawthornden we will provide each child with a reading bag which will be used to hold your child's reading book and any homework. This will be sent home when your child begins their phonics learning. Prior to this, play to learn bags will be sent home and these should be returned each week to allow for resources to be replaced for the next child. More information regarding these will be provided in August. The school will provide all stationery in class, therefore your child does not need a pencil case.

Water Bottle

Children are encouraged to drink water during the school day. Please provide your child with a water bottle, this can be replenished during the day as required, but should come home daily to be washed. School water bottles can be purchased from the office. Please label with your child's name.

Playtime/Snack

At morning break and lunchtime adult playground supervisors look after the children. As we are a Health Promoting School, please support us by giving your child a healthy snack each day - NO NUT products. In addition to this, free fruit is given to each child in P1 on a Wednesday.

Milk

Milk will be available to be purchased for your child to drink in class each day. Milk can be ordered termly or yearly and paid for by cash or through parent pay. If your child is eligible for Free School Meals, Milk and Clothing Grant, you can now do this online at www.midlothian.gov.uk. It is helpful to the school if parents/carers could still complete the online application form if you think you may be eligible, even if your child does not wish to have school meals or milk as it generates additional income for the school.

Lunches

Children can make the following lunch choices:

School lunch

All children in Primary One are entitled to a free meal Monday to Friday. Children are entitled to a packed lunch on a Friday - this must be ordered on their lunch form in advance. Menus are provided by Midlothian Catering Services and are issued termly to all children and you can also view the menu on the Midlothian Council Website.

Packed lunch

Please supply your child's healthy packed lunch in a named box. Packed lunches are to be brought for lunch only. Please ensure that snacks for break are given in small snack pots not lunch bags.

Start of the School Day

At the start of the school day all children will line up in their classes and will be invited into the school by their teacher at their classroom door. Please support your child by encouraging them to line up with their class where possible.

End of the School Day

Please wait in the playground to collect your child. If there is any change in arrangement, please let us know by telephone so that we can reassure your child.

Reporting Absences

If your child will be absent from school please report non-attendance by telephoning the school office before 8:45am on 0131 271 4600. If you have not telephoned us then our office staff will contact you via a text message. If you know in advance that your child is going to be absent please telephone or send a letter to school - it is not necessary to do both!

Keeping your Child safe / Medical

Support staff are on hand to help in the dining hall and support in the playground. The playground supervisors will not recognise every parent, relative or family friend so at break times and lunch times we encourage children to keep away from the railings for their own safety. Parents should report to the office if they need to hand in snacks or other necessary items - please don't pass them through the railings.

We will inform parents if an accident has occurred. A note is always sent home if there has been a bump to the head.

Ensure all personal information is correct and up to date - including emergency contacts. Please send in any changes in writing. It is important to inform the school of any changes to the main contact mobile telephone number as this is the number we use to send text messages.

Inform staff if your child has a specific medical condition - forms for medication need to be filled in and completed. No medication can be given without this consent form.

Allow 48hrs clear for any symptoms of sickness or diarrhoea. Report outbreaks of head lice to staff. We no longer inform parents by letter so check hair regularly and tie long hair back.

The Curriculum

In Primary 1 we follow a play based curriculum alongside some prescriptive literacy and numeracy programmes to ensure your child meets all the expectations within the Early Level curriculum as outlined by Education Scotland. Our classrooms are designed in a way which stimulates a child's drive for exploration and discovery. We believe our environment and curriculum motivates your child to gain mastery over their environment, promoting focus and concentration. It also enables your child to engage in enquiry processes of problem solving, analysing, evaluating, applying knowledge and creativity.

Within our play based curriculum we deliver bike and scooter skills and have play based sessions for P.E. on a weekly basis to develop gross motor skills as well as allowing opportunities for messy play. Messy play fosters creativity and imagination, encourages language and communication skills, practices concentration, and promotes physical development.

Below is an image of one of our Play Based classrooms. Our school is not open plan which benefits our pupils tremendously as although play can be noisy it can be closely monitored and altered for more focused learning tasks.









Home Learning and Workshops for Parents and Carers

Information about ways in which you can help your child and support learning at home will be shared with you at the start of the new session.

We are also looking forward to inviting you to school to share the approaches and the resources we use to teach your child and to involve you in the life of the Primary One classroom.
