# **Authority Visit**



On 2<sup>nd</sup> March, three colleagues from Midlothian Council visited our school to carry out a quality assurance and improvement visit. Our visiting team observed all class teachers teaching, spoke to several learners and a number of school staff throughout the day. Their feedback was very positive, with a particular

emphasis given to the polite manners and engagement of our learners. They highlighted some very good teaching practice which encompassed a variety of adult and pupil led learning, the use of appropriate resources and a good use of assessment strategies. As part of the visit, the team agreed with our areas of development, namely questioning, feedback and embedding the use of digital technologies to enhance learning experiences. We will look to develop our next steps over the coming months and into next session.

As many of you will know, we said farewell to Mrs Martin, who took up a promoted post with Edinburgh Council on 24th February. Miss Neville who has been working at Hawthornden in a support for learning role since last August, has

We have had a very busy term so far with our P4 pupils coming to the end of their swimming block and our P5 pupils about to commence their block of swimming!

The team, along with our JRSOs also work alongside our local police to ensure access in and around our school is as safe as it can be. Our JRSOs also shared with parents/pupils safe routes for them to use when walking to school.

P6 pupils were incredibly lucky to spend a day at the Sky Studio in West Lothian last week, finding out about a range of roles within the television and news industry, which resulted in them writing, presenting and filming their own news reports. A great day was had by all!

At our last Pupil Council meeting, members discussed the possibility of having a football pitch painted on our school field. This suggestion was taken forward by 2 of our P7 Pupil Council representatives, and I am delighted to say, that their request was granted and a pitch has been painted – free of charge! Great negotiating skills P7!

A huge well done to our P5 pupils who participated in the Bonnyrigg and Lasswade Historical Society competition. The entries were fantastic and I have been told we were just pipped at the post by Lasswade Primary School!

P7s are currently undertaking a block of Bikeability which will support our pupils in increasing their confidence and knowledge when cycling on roads/paths etc.

We also have three nurses working with our P7 pupils on a mental health programme called Headstrong. Information regarding this programme was emailed to parents before Christmas. This programme will give our learners strategies to use when life feels overwhelming. I really hope pupils engage with these weekly sessions in order to give them the best opportunity for high school and beyond.

We have taken receipt of 300 trees which we intend to plant around our perimeter fence. On our final day of this term we intend to plant these trees with the help of as many parents/carers/relatives as possible.
