General Information

P.E.

Topic/IDL

We will begin the term with a mini-topic focussing on Scotland which will tie in nicely with Burns Day. Pupils will experience poetry, food, dancing, and songs linked to Burns Day and will end with a ceilidh celebration.

After the February break we will start a new topic based around 'Toys'. This will include looking at the history of toys, purpose of toys and designing a toy.

Literacy

We are continuing to follow the 'Read, Write, Inc' programme which runs throughout the school. Pupils have now been grouped across P1-3 based on their individual learning.

In writing we have been focussing on using adjectives to improve our sentences and have also are starting to use connectives to create more detailed and longer sentences.

Numeracy and Maths

This term we will be developing our understanding of written calculations for addition and subtraction. We will also continue to work on missing number problems and saying number sequences forwards and backwards. Mrs Major will be teaching the children numeracy on a Wednesday with a focus on multiplication.

In Maths we will start by looking at money, followed by fractions and symmetry.
