


Home-School Communication

Polar Explorers

Our IDL topic is Polar Explorers. Through this topic we will develop pupil confidence and awareness of STEM skills applied to real-life scenarios through a range of experiments and investigations. These cover a range of themes such as:

- engineering - the building, loading and launching of the ship
- exploration - life as a polar explorer
- arctic animals - living and surviving in a cold environment
- climate change - observing the signs and predicting the future
- oceans - investigating the oceans and pollution.



We will use our learning in topic as a stimulus to support literacy activities including imaginative writing. Our class novel for the term will be *The Polar Explorers' Club* by Alex Bell.
