COVID-19 Updates

From Monday 12th October our staff in school will be wearing face coverings in line with local and national guidance. Staff need to wear these in all communal areas of the school, including corridors and the school playground.

To support our staff and minimise the risk of infection, we are actively encouraging our families to wear face coverings in the school playground when dropping off and collecting pupils. This is in line with guidance from NHS Lothian. We appreciate your support with this.

A reminder that in the school playground families should follow the 2m social distancing guidance at all times. Wherever possible, only 1 adult should accompany pupils to school to minimise adults in our playground. This again minimises the risk of infection and helps with our school remaining open for our pupils.

In times of wet weather, we are unable to accommodate pupils in the school building before their entry time at present. We understand that this is really difficult but we are unable to accommodate large groups of pupils from different classes within the school building due to our restrictions in mixing classes. Please bring children to school as close to their start time as possible in such weather.

If your child has any of the COVID-19 symptoms, we urge you to contact the school as soon as possible and ensure your child has a test.

A reminder that symptoms are:

High temperature

A new, continuous cough

A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

Please note that if a family member in your household develops symptoms, children should not come in to school until a test has been administered and negative result given. In this situation, please contact the school office as this can change a cause for absence for a child.
