Info for the Term Ahead :

Numeracy and Maths

In numeracy we have been developing our addition strategies, working on repeated addition, number bonds, and number line work. As we progress through this term we will look to increase the range of numeracy strategies to include tallying, partitioning for larger numbers, fractions and more focus multiplication.

For maths we will work towards improving our knowledge of shapes and understanding time. We have recently begun reading the analogue clock.

HWB

Alongside PE with its focus on outdoor play and physical health, I will be doing some topical lessons intended to help the children with self-reflection, empathy and emotional awareness. I'll be using various story books, art resources and videos to approach sensitive aspects of HWB.

Literacy

The school follows the Read, Write Inc literacy programme, and we will be using RWI 4 days a week, with one 'Big Writing' lesson. 'Big Writing' is part of another scheme tailored to improving writing through imaginative and interactive 'missions'.

Seesaw and Homework

As yet I haven't used Seesaw, however in the coming weeks I will begin to upload tasks and activities the children can do at home, to compliment the work happening in the classroom.

I'll be using it for reminders, a way to feed back to parents about our class and for homework. Using Seesaw encourages the children to share learning they have done at home. It is a great way to build class relationships and showcase hard work.
