## P6/7 First Term Reflection

We have had a fantastic first term back in school. We are adapting to a new school 'normal', making sure we do our best to keep ourselves and each other safe.



We have enjoyed being back with our old friends, and building new friendships within the class.

During our first term we focussed on Health and Wellbeing; learning more about our feelings and emotions and developing strategies to support us through difficult times. As we reflected on the past few months, we realised how resilient we were to get through them.

# This term in P6/7

We will be continuing to work hard within Numeracy, Maths and Literacy. In Numeracy we will be focusing on the 5 domains every week which include number sequences and place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, equations and algebra, fractions, percentages and decimals.

In Maths we will be continuing to develop our knowledge of time.

In Literacy we will continue with a skills based approach to reading and comprehension which will take place 4 times a week.



We have recently started our first topic, WWI. There is an air of excitement as we prepare to present our first virtual assembly focusing on Remembrance Day. Our second class novel, War Horse, will support our learning about WW1.
