Positive Behaviour

In P5, we are using a behaviour chart. Pupils are moved up the chart for following the class rules, approaching learning positively and being kind and helpful. I work hard to continually give positive praise and catch pupils behaving in a positive way. If a pupil gets to the top of the chart, this will be celebrated with sharing in class and with a certificate to take home. If a pupil goes beyond the chart (past outstanding!), then they get to choose a prize from my prize box to take home.

I also encourage pupils to work together as a team. As we sit in tables of 4 and 6, each group has a points box and collects group points throughout the week for being good listeners, for being focused and concentrating, for helping and being kind and for tidying up quickly and when asked. On a Friday, we count group points and the winning group also gets to choose a prize from the prize box.

Storytelling

We are so lucky to be receiving weekly visits from Tim, who visits us from the Scottish Storytelling Centre. When he leaves, we use the reading strategy of 'visualisation' to draw some of the characters that he has introduced us to.
