Happy New Year! We hope you had a lovely Christmas break. We have a very busy term ahead full of lots of exciting learning opportunities for everyone and we look forward to sharing some of the wonderful work created by our P6 learners with you across the next few months.

Primary 6 - Term 3

Health and Wellbeing

We will continue with our Building Resilience Programme this term looking at "Respected and Healthy." This will give our learners an opportunity to explore how to maintain a healthy lifestyle physically, mentally and emotionally.

As we continue to work towards our Silver Rights Respecting School Award, we continue to incorporate our Rights into every lesson and talk about them daily. P6 will be focusing on Fitness and Basketball in PE and continuing our work in class developing positive attitudes and working on our Circle of Control.

Literacy

We have already begun work on our Poetry topic within Literacy and learners have been working hard to create some wonderful examples of these already. We will be continuing to develop Listening and Talking skills as learners prepare to present their Scots Poems to the class. Our class novel is 'My Friend Walter' and we will be completing lots of varied short and long reads based on this text. Our talk for Writing focus this term is 'Wishing Stories', which we know learners will love using their imaginations and being creative with.

Numeracy and Mathematics

Our learners will continue to use their knowledge of the four processes each week to continue building their confidence when problem solving.

In term 3, we will be focusing heavily on consolidating knowledge of Fractions, Decimals and Percentages, using lots of practical activities to develop confidence using these skills.

In Mathematics, our focus is Measure and Data Handling, linking well with our class topic of Climate Smarter and using multiplication and division skills in a fun and hands-on manner.

Ethos and Wider Life of the School

Term 3 continues to see further opportunities for extra-curricular activities across the school. Please speak to your child about taking part in these activities. They will be available at lunch time and at the end of the school day.
