

## Rosewell Primary School FAQs

<b>How many classrooms are in the school?</b>
Seven in session 2021-2022 , we will have eight in 2022-2023
<b>What are class sizes?</b>
National guidance is up to: 25 children at P1 stage 30 children at P2 and P3 33 children at P4-P7 25 children in composite classes In Rosewell Primary at the start of session 2021-2022 we had a P1, P2/1, P3/2, P4/3, P5/4, P6 and a P7 class.
<b>Are the lunches split across the school?</b>
Yes: P3/4, P4/5, P6 and P7 are on first sitting at 12.30am P1, P2/1 and P3/2 children are on second sitting at approx. 12/45am
<b>How can parents get involved?</b>
Volunteering in school and by joining the Parent Council. More information is found in our School Handbook.
<b>Will all P1s be in the same class?</b>
There will be a P1 and a P2/1 class.
<b>What games are in the playground?</b>
We are fortunate to have a large playground. With a grassy areas as well as tarmac for ball games. We have various playground toys as well as a 'quiet area' for those children who want to sit and have some quiet time. P7 buddies usually spend the first few weeks supporting P1 in the playground.
<b>Will days be similar to the nursery or straight into learning sounds etc ?</b>
We spend the first week or so settling in and then start introducing sounds and build up other curricular areas.
<b>Will they be in for full days or half days?</b>
We will be full-time from Day 1. If you think that this will not work for you or your child, please contact us.
<b>How will playtime work?</b>
We will have staggered playtime initially
<b>Will children need PE kits?</b>
Yes, at the start of next session we will be returning to full school uniform (we have had a relaxed approach to this) and we will be changing for PE. A bag with a t-shirt, shorts and soft gym shoes is needed but not straight away. Class teachers will advise you. P1s usually start changing for PE later in the first term.
