


# P5 Home Learning 3

<p><b><u>Daily Four!</u></b> Ask someone at home to give you four sums to complete mentally; 1 addition, 1 subtraction, 1 multiplication and 1 division. Explain the <b>strategies</b> you used! Try to do this every day- little and often counts!</p>	<p><b><u>Said is Banned!</u></b> Write down as many words as you can think of that could be used instead of the word 'said' e.g.,  ...shouted replied asked...</p>	<p><b><u>Magic Music</u></b> Mrs Stentiford has put some music activities onto our Teams page for you to have a go at! Why not try one or two?  </p>	<p><b><u>Author's Purpose</u></b> Look around your house and find 10 texts. Remember a text is anything you can read (not just books!) Try to get a good variety!
