School Updates

Covid Updates

Thank you for supporting our school to be a safe place by wearing face coverings at pick up and drop off and by distancing from other households.

We ask that only one adult accompanies their child to school in the morning/collects their child in the afternoon. This is to avoid overcrowding in the playground.

Please note that if you receive a 'warn and inform' letter in your email, this does not mean that your child has been identified as a close contact. It means that a case of confirmed COVID-19 has been reported in a person with links to Sacred Heart Primary School.

Trace and Protect will contact any close contacts accordingly. If you are not contacted by Trace and Protect, your child can attend school/nursery as normal.

Residentials

We are hopeful that residential visits will resume this session and are finalising some provisional bookings with centres.

Labelling Clothes/Personal Items

Nut-Free Snacks

Breakfast Club

Class Updates:

Nursery

We have welcomed some new children into the nursery this week and this have given the children opportunities to form new relationships and has given them ownership of showing them round our setting and supporting them with parts of our daily routines such as modelling handwashing, emotional check in and snack/lunch. It has been so lovely welcoming in new children and meeting their families and we look forward to working in partnership with you all over the coming year.

The children have been sharing their knowledge with each other while exploring a 3D Thinking and talking tub related to our exploration of the book — 'Journey'. Journey is a book with pictures but no words which has encouraged the children to use their imagination while exploring what the story represents for them. The children have been inspired by the magic crayon within the story and have found their own magic crayons within the setting to create their own magic pictures including a magic carpet and magic cape.

The children have continued to explore shapes and have been demonstrating their knowledge of shapes while using the playdough. This led on to making Gingerbread people using the playdough and the children then asked to watch the story on the smartboard. After watching this, the children showed a keen interest in making their own gingerbread people, this gave us the opportunity to discuss good hygiene, to explore measuring using the ingredients and discuss the characters within the story.

Next week we will be welcoming some more children to the setting and we will be continuing to build on children's independence skills as they wash their own dishes after meal times and are also self-serving their own snack.

P1/2

This week in P1/2 we have been continuing to familiarise ourselves with our new learning environment. We have been working on our listening skills and have played games that require us to listen carefully and follow instructions. We enjoyed our PE lesson this week and practised different ways that we are able to travel from one place to another. We have also been working on our counting skills and number formation in Numeracy. We enjoyed Drama on Tuesday with Mrs Browne and already can't wait for our next lesson!

Next week, we will be working in our Read Write Inc. groups. The children have been assessed and grouped appropriately and will be reassessed every six weeks in order to track their progress. In Numeracy, P1 will be focusing on ordering numbers while P2 will be working on solving addition problems. We will continue to explore 2D shape this week with the help of a book called 'Walter's Wonderful Web'.

P2/3

This week in Primary 2/3 we started to work on our story called Meerkat Mail and learned about Meerkats in the wild. We wrote sentences to describe Sonny the Meerkat and looked at different common nouns and proper nouns in the story. We will continue with Meerkat Mail next week to look at different postcards Sonny sends and how we can write our own one to him from Penicuik. In Maths, we solved missing number questions, practiced our counting in 2s and numbers greater than and less than. Next week in maths we will be starting our time topic using the analogue clock. Well Done P2/3!

P4

This week in Primary 4 we have started our class novel called 'The Legend of Podkin One-Ear' by Kieran Larwood. We have been using our novel to show how we can share our understanding of what is going on within the story. Also we have been using it to revise some elements of grammar, such as inverted commas. On Wednesday we took part in Kieran Larwood's map drawing tutorial online. He showed us how to draw our very own fantasy world maps. We added loads of details, including names of countries and towns. Soon we will be using these to write our own Podkin inspired adventure stories.

In numeracy and maths we have started to look at patterns. So far this has included patterns in shape sequences and numbers. We have also been working in our numeracy groups to revise some numeracy strategies, such as counting in 2s, jumps on a number line, sequencing to 100 and inverse operations. In RE, we have focused on the idea that God created us, body mind and soul. We used this idea to draw and write about what our body, mind and soul looks like. Following on from this, we discussed how even though God created us all, He made sure that we were all unique. We used this idea to draw our own self-portraits using oil pastels.

Although we haven't been able to visit the Edinburgh Book Festival this year, we were able to get the Edinburgh Book Festival to visit our classroom remotely! We joined David MacPhail and his discussion on his new book 'Velda the Awesomest Viking.' The book sounded really fun and we're looking forward to getting it for our classroom. He even showed us how to draw and name our very own Viking longboats.

Finally, we are continuing to work on our Netball skills in PE. This week we focused on different ways to throw the ball. In order to practice it was important for us to work in teams and give each other feedback on how we could improve.

P5

Another week is over in Primary 5. In Literacy we began a 3 week novel study of Anne Fine's 'Bill's New Frock.' So far we have read the first two chapters. We have identified key vocabulary, used a dictionary to find its meaning and then used a thesaurus to find synonyms. The pupils enjoyed using the thesaurus to find synonyms and enjoyed being creative with their work choices. Next week we look forward to learning how to write a diary entry as Bill Simpson.

In numeracy, we have been completing a lot of assessment to identify where the gaps are in our learning. We have finally finished and found that we are going to be focusing on Fractions this term. We had a brief introduction to simplifying and finding equivalent fractions. We will begin out unit on fractions next week.

We have also been learning how to draw using perspective. We have drawn a street, the countryside and a forest.

P6

This week in P6 we have been working through assessments to make sure we know the next steps for our learning. On top of that, we have carried on with learning about descriptive language and used what we have learned to create a setting description. In numeracy we also carried out an investigation about combinations of numbers which was very interesting. Next week in numeracy we will be starting to work on sums using the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) as well as working with Time. In literacy we will be starting our novel study of the book 'The Midnight Fox' and using that as context for our writing and grammar. We are also going to start a short topic on electricity for science and we will be learning about circuits and how to draw them. We will be carrying on learning about Kwik cricket during PE on a Wednesday as well as gymnastics with Miss Hardie. On a Thursday we will be working with Mrs Sargison for French and Miss Learmonth for reading comprehension.

P7

Primary 7 have thoroughly enjoyed doing learning linked to the book 'Journey' and have written some fabulous descriptions about the magical forest, well done everyone. This past week we started our novel study 'Clockwork' by Philip Pullman, and have been looking at characterisation and setting as well as extending our vocabulary. Next week, we will be learning about the features of a news article and using this to write our own examples of one. Our grammar focus next week is on word types including: nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs. In maths, we have started work on rounding numbers to the nearest 1, 2 and 3 decimal places and the nearest 10, 100, 1000 and 10000. We have also started rounding addition and subtraction calculations. This will be consolidated next week and then rounding multiplication and division calculations will be introduced as well as rounding word problems. This week we have successfully started our 'Democracy' topic by learning about our rights in Scotland and our responsibilities at home and school. Next week we will be learning about features of a democratic society and comparing these with dictatorship. In P.E we will continue with gymnastics looking at different types of rolls and introducing handstands and cartwheels.
