Health and Safety Reminders:

- As per Midlothian Guidance, we request that each pupil is accompanied by **only one adult**, when entering the school grounds. We are asking all adults to keep a **2m distance** from anyone **not in their own household**, and to wear a face covering if able to do so. To avoid congestion at our nursery gate, we would encourage nursery parents/carers to use our garden as a waiting space. Children will be brought to the nursery gate, by staff, and dismissed one at a time.
- Whilst we are always keen to welcome our families into our school grounds, we request that parents/carers **do not** arrive early for drop off and pick up, as this adds to congestion, particularly when other class groups are passing. If bringing younger siblings please ensure that they are closely supervised at all times. Unfortunately we are unable to allow them access to school outdoor play equipment at this time.

Parking and Vehicle Access

Please note that there will be **no vehicle access to school grounds except for pupil taxis, blue badge holders and staff**. Parents and carers without the appropriate permits are asked to use the Visitors Car Park and other parking areas outside the school grounds. A member of management will be present at the school gate to supervise/manage access. Thank you for your support in implementing this important safety measure.

School Chrome Books:

We would be grateful if any class Chrome Books, borrowed during this lock-down, could be returned to school **on Monday 15th March**. **Please also remember to send in the charger cable**. Thank you.
