Literacy and English

- Read a text of your choice for a minimum of 15-20 minutes per day. You may choose to read a novel, a story to a sibling, a newspaper report or an information book about something that interests you.

Numeracy and Mathematics

- Create a poster based on learning in class to help teach others about a concept
