Lesson Number	Learning Intention	Activity Overview
1	L.I. To recognise the different ways that we look after babies and young children.	<p>The mystery egg has hatched in P1 and given us a lovely baby monster. After coming up with a variety of name ideas we decided that the baby monster should be called... Wojtek!</p> <p>Do you have a teddy at home that could be your baby monster? What name will you give to it? Why don't you come up with some name ideas and then ask your friends and family to choose their favourite? How are you going to look after your baby monster? Will you need to get it some special food? Will you need to sing it some lullabies to get it to sleep?</p> <p>Try to send me some photographs on Seesaw to show me how you are looking after your new friend.</p>
2	L.I. To design and make a model using a variety of materials.	<p>Now that your baby monster has settled in why don't you make it a nice den to live in? The baby monster probably likes dark, cosy spaces like those below.</p>

		 <p>What can you make?</p>
3	L.I. To identify materials that are waterproof.	<p>(A good task to take on during a rainy day.) Baby monster wants to go and play out in the rain, but he doesn't have a raincoat to keep him dry. What material could we make a raincoat out of?</p> <p>How will we know if it is waterproof? How can you test it out?</p>
4	L.I. To design protective clothing, justifying material choices based on their properties.	<p>Baby monster wants to go and cycle his bike, but he doesn't have a cycling helmet.</p> <p>What kind of materials would make a good cycling helmet? Should they be hard or soft? What materials can you find around your house that could be used?</p> <p>You could try and make a cycling helmet for an egg (maybe even a chocolate one) using materials you have found and then test it out by dropping it from a height.</p>
