

P3/4's Farming Topic

Lesson Number	Learning Intention	Activity Overview
1	To explain what I know about farms	<p>Make a poster explaining everything you know about farms right now. It doesn't matter how much you know just write down everything and draw pictures to go with it. Once you have finished this post a picture of it to Seesaw and keep it safe as you will need this at the end of your topic.</p>
2	To know there are different types of farms	<p>Research which different types of farms there are. In particular find out what the terms arable, pastoral and mixed mean. Create your own definition for these and write them down.</p>
3	To make a model	<p>Using whichever materials you have make your own model of a farm. (It could be anything, drawn pictures that you cut out, playdough, blu-tac, cardboard etc). You can make it as large or as small as you wish. Do you want animals on the farm? Which ones? How many fields will you have? How many buildings? Be as creative as you want! Make a list.</p> <p>Zoom out from this farm and then look at other local farms. How many can you find? Do they all have similar buildings and equipment?</p>

6	To create a patchwork effect piece of art	<p>Google 'aerial farm pictures'. Notice from the images that farms are a 'patchwork' of different areas, buildings and fields.</p> <p>Create your own patchwork picture of a farm. How you decorate your picture is up to you. You could just colour it in with pencils and pen. If you have paint you could paint it. If you have tissue paper or old material you could cut these up and stick them down. Be as creative as you want! Once you've finished your picture upload a photo of it to Seesaw.</p>

7	To learn what a dairy farm is	<p>Watch this video showing the day in the life of a dairy farmer.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-BFNEKQTgW0</p> <p>Draw a storyboard (A set of pictures) showing what happens each day in the life of a dairy farmer. Make sure you write sentence to go with each picture. Upload your storyboards to Seesaw.</p>
8	To name different dairy products	<p>In the video from the previous lesson the farmer told us about some of the foods that are made from milk. Can you remember what they are?</p> <p>Make a poster about all the different types of food made from milk. Once you've finished upload it to Seesaw.</p>
9	To name different types of farm machinery	<p>Look at each picture of farm machinery in the presentation below on Seesaw.</p> <p>https://app.seesaw.me/pages/shared_activity?share_token=F1875YjIS7ajgr6W-K-nGg&prompt_id=prompt.dfad9a21-e095-47c6-afdf-5ed60abe31b3</p> <p>Find out what job each piece of machinery has. Use the microphone tool to read to me what it is you've found out.</p> <p>Which are your favourites? Why? My favourite are John Deere tractors because they are green and yellow and look cool!</p>

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10	To learn about farm animals in other countries	<p>Use the internet to find out information about alpacas. They are an animal found on farms but not traditionally in this country.</p> <p>Using whichever materials you have draw a picture of an alpaca. Upload this to Seesaw. When you upload your picture include 3 facts about alpacas in the comments section.</p>
11	To learn the journey of a pea	<p>Watch this video about the process of how peas go from a field to your freezer.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qnhqkhEVZuI</p> <p>Write down 5 facts that you've learnt from watching the video.</p>
12	To learn where potatoes originally come from	<p>Watch this video about potatoes</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=lyBuY-DnCJc</p> <p>Where do potatoes originally come from? Draw a map showing where we are and where they came from. On your map write down the name of the person who first brought potatoes to the UK (you'll have to do more investigating to find this out).</p>
