Dear Parents and Carers

I would like to extend a personal thank you to all for your continued support at the start of this term. I know that many of you are supporting your children and young people while juggling other responsibilities and appreciate the challenge that presents.

Last week I had the pleasure of a virtual meeting with the Chairs of our Parent Councils and was heartened to hear their very positive comments about the range of learning activities being offered to pupils. I am sure you appreciate the extent to which teachers are going to in providing 'live' learning opportunities and check -in style interactions with their children. I recognise that staff, in both our schools and working remotely, are planning well to meet the learning needs of learners and I understand the challenge for those who do so whilst supporting their own children with their learning.
