Appropriate Clothing

It is imperative that the children come to school wearing jackets – ideally with hoods. As the weather turns colder, we might find ourselves in the difficult position of having to decide whether a child is dressed warmly enough to go outside. As children have the right to fresh air and the opportunity to exercise, we endeavour to send the children outside as much as possible, including when it is raining lightly. If the weather conditions are adverse or dangerous, we ensure the children enjoy their break time indoors, but would greatly appreciate clothing that suits the coldest weather, to ensure they get a break outside to prepare them for learning across the day

St David's High School Open Evening

St David's High School are holding an open evening for this year's P6/7s to attend with their families on 8th **November, 6-8pm.** This will be an opportunity for the children to have a tour around the school and hear from some of their new teachers. You do not need to sign up, but simply go along on the night.

P3-5 Swimming

Please remember swimming every Friday morning. Children should come to school in their uniforms (except on dress down days), and bring their swimming kit and towel with them in a separate bag.

PE this year will be taught on a **Monday** and **Wednesday**. Children should come to school wearing their PE kits as it ensures that children do not need to use their PE time to get changed twice.

Please be reminded that no clothing associated with football clubs should be worn to school, during PE or

when representing the school in the locality. Pupils should wear white T shirts / shorts/ trainers/tracksuit bottoms for PE, a St Matthew's Hoodie or Jumper may be required all year round.

Breakfast Club & Morning Arrival

We offer a breakfast club to all pupils at a cost of 50p per day – payments via **parent pay** (free to pupils entitled to free school meals). Pupils are invited to join in various games & art activities and given a healthy breakfast. The club runs between 8.30 am and 8.50 am - due to staffing we cannot allow children into the school prior to **8.30 am**. No booking necessary.

Please could we remind parents that the playground is unsupervised in the mornings and the doors do not open until 8.50 am. Due to safety reasons, we ask that pupils are not left <u>unattended</u> in the playground early in the mornings.

Nut-Free Snacks

Due to severe nut allergies at our school, please do not send your child to school with snacks or lunch items containing nuts. This includes, but is not limited to, Kinder Buenos, Nutella, Daim bars and peanut butter. Please note that any snacks with nuts in them will be sent home with the child. We very much encourage healthy snacks such as fruit.



Parking

If you absolutely need to drop your child to school or collect them using your car, please ensure you park inside the Whitehill grounds and avoid parking on the roadside, particularly either side of the entrance/exit of the football grounds. When parking on the roadside outside the grounds, visibility can be affected for cars entering and exiting the stadium grounds, which could lead to an accident.

Our JRSOs continuing to put cones out every day to encourage and guide safe parking and as always, we are grateful and appreciative of these cones being adhered to. Thank you for your continued support on this matter.

Medication

If your child requires any medication (including inhalers, 2 required to be held in school) while at school, please ensure that you have completed the relevant medication form. These are available from Mrs Golder at the school office.

As per our administration of medication policy, we cannot administer this medication without parental consent and permission forms need to be completed by parents prior to us administering any medication. Please also ensure all medication sent to school is in date and includes the dispensing label from the pharmacy if a prescribed medication.

Class Updates P1-3

In P1-3 this week we have been enjoying Halloween, reading new stories, and learning through playing. On Monday, we spent time using primary colours to mix the colour of our skin with paint - this was tricky but we learnt a lot about resilience and which colours to add to change the tone of the paint. On Tuesday, we created potions and wrote out the ingredients. In the afternoon, we had a blast at our school Halloween party! In the classroom, we practised adding through Halloween activities such as pin the nose on the witch, dooking for apples, and throwing rings on the witches hat. The P1s have been busy making sound crafts for the letters 'c', 'k' and 'u' and practising their reading and blending

skills with CVC words. We have also spent time learning about odd and even numbers this week using numicon to help us. We are very good at identify odd and even numbers! We have also enjoyed doing some art this week using chalks and learning different techniques of shading, smudging, and drawing lines. Next week we start out new topic on The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark!







P3-5

This week in Literacy, we have been working on our text study. We learned about the different Saxon kingdoms that existed in Britain at the time that our novel was set. We compared the map to what Britain looks like now, and used our problem solving skills to create a map using county domino cards. We looked at adverbs used in the text, and discussed what other adverbs could be used instead. We also discussed inference, and tried to work out how the character was feeling based on clues in the text. We will be looking at more inference next week, as well as learning more about life in the past.



In Numeracy, we have been learning about division. We learned that division is when we split a number into equal groups and discussed

how we can use our times tables knowledge to help us to divide. We will build on this learning next week by looking at different strategies to help us to divide.

P5-7

In literacy have started our film study looking at WALL-E. This week we continued working on our inferencing skills by making small cartoon strips of what WALL-E and EVE could be saying and the evidence we have as to why we think that. We have also been answering understanding questions in full sentences, using the question to help form our answer. For Black History Month the theme is 'Celebrating Our Sisters' and we had to research different women and what they were the first to do.

In numeracy we have started looking at division and fractions. To start division we have been looking at the link between division and multiplication. Looking at fact families and how it can help us solve missing number sums. For fractions some groups have been looking at recreating the whole fraction, for example if we have 1/3 how many more to make a whole? Other groups have been working on mixed and improper fractions and how to write them.

This week in PE we didn't have the hall so we did PE in the classroom and outside. We had a great time

doing Go Noodle and doing they did years ago. We also groups leading lunchtime games club with the P1-3s we have been doing an art different Saints, we found many Saints for almost

We loved the Halloween party this week and we enjoyed wearing our costumes to the party on Tuesday. We have really been enjoying our calm yoga time at the end of every day, this helps us move and stretch our bodies and also keep our minds nice and calm too.
