Transitions Principle: Expectations



Elmer stands out from the crowd because he looks different from other elephants. Elmer finds it hard to be different to everyone else and must come to terms with how he looks and behaves. Along with all the rest of the elephants, Elmer learns to value and celebrate his unique characteristics. This story celebrates diversity and helps children to understand why everyone is unique and special.

Things to do and explore

- Encourage children to create their own elephant, talk about colour, shape, pattern etc.
- Go for a colour walk and see how many different colours you can see.
- Encourage the children to share a joke, just like Elmer.
- Encourage children to share what makes them special or what they like about a friend.
- Use a non-fiction book to find out more about elephants.
- Create a display about elephants for the children to interact with and discuss.

Questions you might ask:

- Can you name some of Elmer's colours?
- How do you think Elmer felt being different to all the other elephants?
- What other animals did Elmer meet on his jungle walk?
- Why did the other animals not recognise Elmer?
- What happened to Elmer when the rain came?

Encourage children to move like jungle animals.
