We have joined with Ladywood Leisure Centre and can now offer a Breakfast Club there which is free of charge for a maximum of 30 children. The club runs from 7.30am each day and is staffed by the leisure centre and 2 of our learning assistants from school. Children receive breakfast and then play games in the sports hall before school staff walk them to school for 8.50am. If you would like a space for your child, please let the school office know and someone from the breakfast club will be in touch with you.

As you know we have traffic restrictions in place at the front and the back of school during drop off and pick up times. This is for the safety of our children. The drop off option in the staff car park is no longer in place. Please do not park on the double yellow lines at any time. We are very concerned about the extent of traffic in this area at the start and end of the day and as such it may be necessary to close the car park at these times. We will continue to monitor this area over the next few weeks. While we appreciate that these are very busy times in the day for you and restrictions can be inconvenient, the safety of our children is of utmost importance to us. Please support us by adhering to the restrictions in place and being mindful of children when driving in surrounding areas of the school.

You may be aware of the literacy toolbar Read&Write. We use this toolbar in school to support learning and it is installed on all pupil iPads and Chromebooks. The very exciting news is that Midlothian has negotiated a world-first deal that means you can now download the Read&Write toolbar at home, on up to 5 devices for free!
