## Growth Mindset Assembly



#### Low Port



The children worked together to present an assembly all about International Day of Peace. We worked on presenting skills to share information and learn a song.




# Talk for Writing

In maths we have been learning to measure things, from as small as the width of our finger to using metre sticks to work out the size of the MUGA. P5 love measuring everything!







## Enterprise Group




Tynewater Values have all been linked to the articles of the UNCRC and shared with all children, staff and our families.



# Going for Gold


Our pupil voice leadership group has been working hard on our journey to the Gold award.
