We had a great time at the Christmas lunch and also at our Party. We danced our socks off, played all of the game well and were fantastic dancing to The Grand Old Duke of York.






Winter Artwork

Children in Need


We all enjoyed dressing up in our pyjamas and some of us enjoyed breakfast at school too. We learned all about where the money we raised goes and who it helps
