Information for Parents - Outline Plan for Learning and Teaching

Topic / Project Title: Coal Mining

Languages

Reading: We will continue to progress through the Oxford Reading Tree and Treetop books. The children will begin to undertake reading comprehension tasks based on their books.

Writing: We will continue to use talk for writing to develop our ability to recreate the structure of a story using model texts. Our class novel is Canary in the Coal Mine by Madelyn Rosenberg.

Spelling and Grammar: We will continue to progress through the Jolly Grammar framework for learning phonics.

Mathematics

Numeracy: We will continue to consolidate and learn new strategies to solve addition, subtraction and multiplication sums. We will continue to use the Basic Facts progression to improve our speed, accuracy and knowledge of number bonds and test our progress weekly using Big Maths Beat That.

Mathematics:

We will learn how to tell time to 5 and one minute intervals as well as calculating duration.

We will be introduced to digital time and recognise the link between 12 and 24 hour time.

We will produce artwork linked to our topic.
