



Midlothian Schools Ski Programme

Course: 007

Thursday 04th November – 09th December 6 weeks inclusive

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Midlothian Councils Education Division offer ski courses to pupils in Primary 4 and above. The above course is being offered to your child's class, and we wish to invite your child/children to attend.

The cost is: **£60.00** or **£40.00** if claiming free school meals, clothing grant or if you have 2 or more children taking part in the same ski programme.

Please liaise with the school directly regarding payment method and payment due date.

Most pupils with additional support requirements can actively take part.

Transport will be provided to and from Midlothian Snow sports Centre.

I have included a list of what participants should wear and bring along with them.

The consent form attached must be completed and returned to your school prior to your child/children's skiing course. Without a completed consent form they cannot take part.

School Course ability levels

Total Beginner	Never been skiing
Level 1	Snowplough from green path
Level 2	Snowplough turns from first red path
Level 3	Snowplough turns with parallel traverse
Level 4	Polished plough parallel from first red path
Level 5	Basic parallel from first red path
Level 6	Parallel with pole plant from second red path
Level 7	Parallel with pole plant from the top. Short swings. Carving.
Mountain Masters	Introduction to carving freestyle.

Important information regarding personal equipment:

Please make sure your child knows what size shoes they wear so that ski boots can be fitted easily.

Any pupil with long hair should have it tied up in a low pony tail and no gel, wax, hairspray or other hair products should be used on ski days.

Midlothian Snowsports Centre skis in all weathers, therefore children should come with appropriate clothing each week. For reasons of safety, it is a requirement that arms and legs are covered and gloves worn at all times on the ski slope

There are no lockers available at Midlothian Snowsports Centre and school teachers will be responsible for a roller bag with pupil's shoes. We would ask that any valuables are left at home on ski days.

A bottle of water should be brought each week (no fizzy drinks). A snack can be brought with schools permission however pupils should not bring school bags or rucksacks to the centre.

During colder weather, from September to April

Your child will need:

Warm trousers or loose fitting jogging bottoms (thin leggings are not advised) Warm jumper and a waterproof jacket or similar (no loose cords) Waterproof outerwear is recommended Ski or good hard wearing warm gloves Warm/thick long socks

During warmer weather, May to June:

You will need:

Tracksuit or loose fitting jogging bottoms (thin leggings are not advised) Sweatshirt/jumper or jacket Ski or good hard wearing warm gloves Good quality sun cream is advisable

It is advisable to bring a change of clothing, particularly in wet weather and if the group are returning to school.

Waterproof jacket and trousers are strongly advised for rainy days regardless of season;

Please wear pony tails low and do not use hair gel on ski days
