Languages

Reading: We are reading 1 or 2 books together as a class after break or lunch time. The children will engage with a range of different questions whilst listening and following along. We have been learning about the different parts of a book and sharing our likes and dislikes with one another.

Spelling and Grammar: Primary 1 have begun learning our initial sounds, following the Jolly Phonics framework. The first sounds they will learn over the course of the next few weeks are: **s**, **a**, **t**, **i**, **p**, **n Writing**: Primary 1 will have daily practice of writing their names independently. We will also learn about correct letter formation when writing our first set of sounds. These can be practiced at home.

Expressive Arts

Primary 1 will have the opportunity to use a range of art materials and resources during topic time and free play in the atrium and classroom. In our classroom area there will always be a writing and creative table with a broad range of resources for children to explore and have the freedom to be creative with.

Social Studies

Our class topic for this period will be 'All About Me'. The children will engage in a range of activities including: drawing a self portrait, drawing their family members and identifying their likes and dislikes. We will be learning to recognise that we are all different and that is what makes us all unique.

Health & Wellbeing

PE: Primary 1 will be learning to move our bodies in a variety of different ways including running, jumping, skipping and walking. We will be learning to move around different spaces making sure we lookout for others and protect our space bubbles. **HWB:** This Period Primary 1 will meet the characters from Friendship Terrace who will help us to learn how to be good friends to others in our class. We are learning to share resources and space with others and we will have a large focus on our emotions and knowing who we can speak to if we feel sad.

Mathematics

Numeracy: Primary 1 are learning to recognise and order numbers up to 10. We will be learning how to form each of the numerals correctly and will practise writing our numbers 0-10 daily in a range of different ways, for example on paper, with paint or in glitter. We will practice counting up to and beyond 20

verbally, for example when we are counting how many children are in the line.

Mathematics: This period, Primary 1 will be learning about pattern. We will be learning to recognise and continue repeating patterns with colours, shapes and numbers.

All About Me

RME

Primary 1 will focus on the importance of caring and sharing this period, thinking about what is fair and unfair and who we can ask for help if we think something is unfair.
