 We are sorry to disappoint many, however yesterday, having deliberated for over a week, we decided to cancel taking part in the above educational excursion for the following reasons: We were experiencing too many real and / or perceived 'unknowns' and potential risks involved. We needed to be sure that all our children and staff would be totally safe and for everyone, including parents at work or at home, and other staff in school, to have peace of mind throughout the whole day. We did not feel confident about this. 	 There are the real possibilities of undue, long delays in travelling to, in and from Glasgow. There is the ever-present possibility of actions by protestors in Glasgow and on the motorway. As always, please contact me if you have any feedback, questions, suggestions, concerns, or simply need to talk through something. I am always happy to speak with you about any matter relating to your child(-ren). We can do this by telephone, via a video meeting, or exceptionally still in person. 	
 Last week with our P2 and P3 pupils travelling by coach to and from New Lanark, "we had a taste" of what it was like for everyone when, because of an accident on the bypass, the outwards journey took two hours instead of one, and the coaches returned 45 minutes late to go onto their high school pick-ups. Advice from Police Scotland is not to travel to Glasgow during the COP26 Conference unless it is absolutely necessary.
